The year 2021 The pandemic continues and a war is being prepared in the heart of Europe. Another terrible reminder that we are all vulnerable. A reminder that what we have today may disappear tomorrow.

In all conflicts there are winners and losers, but it feels like the same people always lose. The social divide and inequality continue to grow and many people wonder what they need to do to avoid the increasing risks. Climate risks, geo-strategic risks, social risks...

But we can make this change. Mundukide gives a little bit of help to solve so many problems. A drop, which, when combined with others, we hope will become a current. That drop of water so longed for by the dry land of the Global South is, in our case, the work carried out in Mozambique, Ethiopia, Brazil, Colombia and Ecuador. It materialises in 17,100 direct participants in our programmes. More than 74,000 people drink from that drop and also benefit from our actions. The actions that arise from the inter-cooperation between co-operatives, NGOs, donors and volunteers that is materialised in the collaboration with 50 entities and 35 co-operatives that we support. In 2021 we generated more than 8 million Euros to drive social transformation with cooperative work as an engine of development.

We cannot let the many problems lead us to a feeling of victimhood, because the inhabitants of the North are still privileged and there are many others who are still looking their opportunity. We can help in our daily lives and in our immediate environment. But we can also do it much further afield. Mundukide brings these much sought-after opportunities to very distant places. In addition, we have a new strategic plan that sets new goals to increase our impact and we continue to strive to achieve them. Because we are convinced that by working for cooperation we help to prevent inequalities and wars. Because the values that encourage us to cooperate are the opposite of those that encourage conflict and injustice.

Let's not be led to believe that there's nothing we can do because it's not true. Mundukide is good proof of this. Don't put off until tomorrow what you can cooperate today!

PROGRAMME GOALS

To promote sustainable socio-economic development and strengthen the associativity of rural organisations

2021 ASSESSMENT

- In 2021, the pandemic has affected daily life in Ecuador intermittently, allowing Mundukide to define the start of its work with the identified actors.
- With the Toisán Corporation (Intag Valley, Cotacachi-Imbabura), lines have been established for joint work focused on increasing the commercial, entrepreneurial and organisational capacities of 10 small social enterprises under an approach focu-




sing on network, innovation, competitiveness, environmental conservation and women's rights. In addition, a small proposal has been implemented to share and strengthen the knowledge and production of local medicinal plants used to strengthen the respiratory and immune system, among 65 rural people in Intag (63 women and 2 men).

- A collaboration agreement has been signed with the Instituto Superior Tecnológico de la Economía Popular y Solidaria (ISTEPS) based in Cuenca for a shared collaboration.
- With Wiñak (Kichwa association of Archidona-Napo-Amazon), a diagnosis has been carried out on the ground, accompanying them in the development of an action plan for the year 2022.

2022 GOALS

- Alongside the Toisán Corporation, to strengthen the process of 10 social enterprises in Cotacachi towards a joint commercialisation model.
- To accompany and follow up on the Wiñak association's 2022 action plan.
- To continue with the identification of representative actors to work with.
- To execute a new exchange trip with Laboral Kutxa, so that young Basques can learn about the Andean-Amazonian contrast in the defence of life and territory.



Luis Robalino (President of Corporación Toisán): Mundukide's presence will allow us to strengthen and empower small social enterprises, mostly driven by organised groups of women from the Intag area and the Cotacachi canton, who seek, in their socio-economic sustainability, an alternative way of life and resistance against the mega-mining that has been threatening our valley since the 1990s.



AGRICULTURAL PROMOTION OF INDIGENOUS PASTURES

PROGRAMME GOALS

Strengthening food sovereignty, family economy and resilience to external events of indigenous women, Pasto de Nariño .

2021 ASSESSMENT

In 2021, the programme had a complicated start due to the political situation and the national strikes in Colombia, caused by the announcement of the tax reform bill proposed by Iván Duque's government. Once the work had begun, we were able to see that the groups benefiting from the programme have suffered greatly as a result of the pandemic, leading to destructuring in some cases. Little by little, new groups interested in the programme are being created, with the aim of reducing production costs by improving the agroecological production methodology.

It has taken time to structure the Mundukide team on the ground and above all to assimilate the change of paradigm in rural extension without falling into welfarism.

2022 GOALS

- To consolidate a rural extension model outside the current paradigm of welfarism, based on the participation of indigenous women dedicated to production and their social possibilities. Based on production of agro-ecological transition, with a decrease in the cost of production.
- To increase the real participation of women in the project, empowering them, and in the indigenous governance structures.
- To create a small network of short marketing circuits.

PROGRAMME GOALS

To articulate the recyclers' organisations to create a single entity in the provision of recycling services in the region of Pasto.

2021 ASSESSMENT

Priority has been given to identifying and training women leaders in the recycling sector. Despite dealing with an unstable situation, the programme has achieved consolidation among the Alianza de Recicladores/as de Pasto (Pasto Recyclers' Alliance), and other organisations with different objectives. At the same time, a sufficient critical mass has been created to demand the mayor's office complies with the PGIRS (Integrated Solid Waste Management Plan) and to obtain an ECA (recycling sorting station) by the end of the year, where a self-managed group has begun the economic activity. The expectations of the recycling base are high and good results are expected by 2022.

2022 GOALS

- Consolidation of the Pasto Recyclers' Alliance (ARP) and their participation in the provision of the recycling service.
- To increase the number of recyclers participating as members of this alliance.
- To consolidate ARSOC (south-western recyclers' association) and through it create alliances similar to the ARP in the capitals of the southwest.

AID WORKERS

PROGRAMME GOALS

We contribute to the socio-economic development of the MST families who are settled and camped, providing management training to local people of reference to improve the performance of the cooperatives, from production to marketing.

2021 ASSESSMENT

The Covid crisis has continued to affect the work of the Programme in 2021. In the first half of the year, assistance and the 4 training sessions for 512 participants were still mostly carried out online. The second half of the year saw the start of face-to-face assistance and training sessions, although still far from the pre-pandemic normality.

In 2021, the work of previous years continued. In the state of Ceará, the process of launching the five agro-industries has continued. The strengthening of assistance in the MST marketing processes has focused on the consolidation of public sales systems and the opening of new shops - "Armazens do Campo" following the shop model built with participation. Finally, assistance continued to be provided to the monitoring groups in the southern states. Assistance to cooperatives was given online in the first half of the year and more face-to-face in the second half. In total, 21 cooperatives with a total of 5011 members have been assisted.

Finally, as the achievement of the year, we can highlight the implementation of the e-learning platform for the training of cooperatives as planned. The implementation was carried out with the Josué de Castro Education Institute (iejc.edu.br), having created both the platform and the training content within it.

"We can highlight the partnerships and collaborations that have taken place throughout our history and we are particularly proud of the one between MST and the MUNDUKIDE foundation, which has shared its cooperative experience with us in a partnership of more than 15 years. In Paraná, this partnership is made possible through the Cooperativa Central De Reforma Agraria-CCA/PR and the Mundukide Foundation, and has carried out direct follow-up work with grassroots cooperatives to improve the management process that has strengthened our cooperatives, food production and the development of settlements. We believe that we still have a lot to do and build in the field of cooperation and that the historical experience of the Basque people can help us a lot".

PROGRAMME GOALS

To improve agricultural production and productivity of farming families through training, crop diversification, implementing good agricultural practices in dual-purpose crops (both food and cash crops) and facilitating access to agricultural inputs and credit.

2021 ASSESSMENT

The year has been marked by the war in Tigray and the declaration of a state of emergency. In order to implement the programme's goals, different agricultural activities were planned for each productive season. In particular, during the short rainy season, more than 100 women in 6 different districts were brought together to promote fruit growing through the creation of fruit orchards. This involved the planting of 5,500 fruit trees with a high commercial value. Unfortunately, the rainy season activities were postponed due to the armed conflict. Finally, during the dry season, the programme focused on the promotion of domestic poultry farming by promoting small-scale chicken farming among 60 families.

- To increase the agricultural production and productivity of farmers in Arsi in the dominant crops of the area.
- To strengthen institutional and community relations in support of rural women with the im of strengthening their economic empowerment.
- To start working in the environmental sector, promoting the community sustainable management and recovery of degraded areas.

Mozambique

PROGRAMME GOALS

To increase the capacity of the local population in the Lichinga-Pemba corridor to generate income that contributes to equitable and sustainable development, enabling people to be autonomous, resilient and self-sufficient.

2021 ASSESSMENT

The programme has been conditioned by the armed conflict in Cabo Delgado, where the Government of Mozambique, supported by international military forces, has been fighting a jihadist insurgency for over four years. The conflict has led to a high number of displaced people and has conditioned the displacement of groups of people within the province, making it difficult to put into practice the programme's methodology, which had achieved such good results.

AID WORKERS

This situation has forced us to change our approach, moving to a conservative position in the province of Cabo Delgado, with the idea of consolidating what has already been achieved so far. While in the province of Niassa, the objective is to grow and expand the impact of the programme, in the places where we already work, and also by opening new districts.

Likewise, we have managed to negotiate greater flexibility with the funding entities in the geographical area, in order to implement activities in those places where they can have a greater impact.

Thus, we must highlight:

- Opening of activities in new districts in the province of Niassa, Lago Sanga, Ngauma and Mwembe, which together with those of Marrupa, Majune and Mandimba mean that we are present in 7 districts in Niassa. In Cabo Delgado, despite the difficulties, we continue in Balama, Montepuez and Namuno. This means that we are present in ten districts in the nor thern corridor of Mozambique.
- 2) The Mundukide team is composed of four development workers and a local team of 29 people, including production managers, administration managers and guards.
- 3) Production: two production lines have been worked on. On the one hand, in the more consolidated crops such as sesame and vegetables, the programme provides increasingly indirect support, guaranteeing access to inputs and promoting self-management. On the other hand, for new or less consolidated crops (pigeon bean, mung bean, common bean, soya bean), more direct support is provided, focusing on technical assistance (farmer-to-farmer methodology), access to inputs and facilitating marketing, with a commitment to diversified, profitable, sustainable and self-managed agricultural production.
- 4) Marketing network. In Cabo Delgado, work continues with local traders to facilitate access to agricultural inputs (seeds, fertilisers, etc.) in the villages.

Alfonso Nuñez (Aid worker in Cabo Delgado) "There are wars in Africa that people don't want the world to know about, but the people who endure them go through the same suffering as the ones that are shown in the media. As a result of the armed conflict in the province of Cabo Delgado, we are accompanying displaced people who flee their homes and come to Mundukide to start a farming activity that allows them to restart the lives of entire families. Despite this emerging work, Mundukide's priority mission remains to accompany 50,000 people in 10 districts in northern Mozambique to increase agricultural production and marketing".

2022 GOALS

- To consolidate the growth of the programme in the province of Niassa.
- To develop and consolidate methodologies that contribute to increasing the impact of the programme.
- To facilitate access to inputs, materials and equipment necessary for the application of the promoted techniques/crops.
- To facilitate access to the market for the sale of the surplus.



Enelesse Devisone: (*Niassa farmer*): "I am very grateful to Mundukide for selling me the soya seed at a normal price, teaching me the sowing technique and finding a market at a good price. With the proceeds I built a house with a metal roof and sent my son to university. Next year I will increase the production area of soybeans, sesame and boer beans".





Education for Intercooperative Social Transformation

EDUCATION FOR SOCIAL TRANSFORMATION

GEHIKOOP works from a local-global perspective, contributing the vision and thinking of partner organisations to promote people's responsibility towards society and our environment from a global perspective.

Priority groups of the activity:

- Cooperative environment: aimed at people from cooperatives with a long history in the field of social transformation and who are sensitive to the issue. So far, Arizmendi Ikastola, Fagor Ederlan, Copreci and Maier have been the protagonists of the process.
- 2 Educational environment: The aim of this line is to create and disseminate resources for the development of a socially committed person, with a critical local-global and entrepreneurial outlook. To this end, we are collaborating with Mondragon Unibertsitatea and Arizmendi Ikastola.
- **3** Society as a whole: The contributions and itineraries carried out with both cooperative members and students should have an impact on society as a whole. Care is taken to ensure that each itinerary has a part that gives back to the community in the broadest sense of the term, and that it can generate action on the part of the community to become involved in processes of social transformation.

COOPERATIVE ENVIRONMENT

Operational groups from ARIZMENDI IKASTOLA, COPRECI, EDERLAN and MAIER took part in the reflection and training sessions that have been held over the last two years, working with four cooperatives belonging to the Landless Workers' Movement in Brazil, COCAVI, COOPAN, COO-PERUNIAO and CAMINHOS do SABER. The first meetings were held virtually and in November 2021 we received a visit from 8 members of the aforementioned cooperatives and the national management. The visit allowed the allied co-operatives to interact with each other and, as well as getting to know each other in person, they worked together on technical areas, challenges, contradictions and virtues that we have in common. The trip also served to learn more about cooperatives of interest such as Eroski, Mondragon Unibertsitatea, etc. in greater depth.

I was very impressed with the importance given to education and training. Great emphasis is placed on the training of worker-members, with the consequences that this has on the quality of the management of the cooperatives here. This quality and professionalism shows us a lot. With Mundukide we learnt a lot from the work started in Brazil, our co-operatives improved a great deal in terms of training people, and during our visit here we learnt a lot about the results that can be achieved by strengthening the training areas. We have seen first-hand the results of the work carried out in education.

Cesar Bastardo (Member of Gehikoop for F. Ederlan) EDERLAN's objective in joining the GEHIKOOP project was and still is to get to know and exchange experiences with other cooperatives in the world in order to broaden our view of social transformation. To this end, we consider it very valuable to be able to share spaces with people from the MST cooperatives with whom we discuss the difficulties and challenges that we have as cooperatives acting in the capitalist system, but with a vocation for social transformation.

EDUCATIONAL ENVIRONMENT

In the educational environment of GEHIKOOP, we spent the academic year in collaboration with different Mondragon Unibertsitatea campuses and Arizmendi Ikastola, with the aim of integrating a series of principles and values that promote universal solidarity into the students' leaving profile. In total, we have worked with 20 classes of students with the collaboration of around thirty teachers.


VOLUNTEER WORK IN BRAZIL
